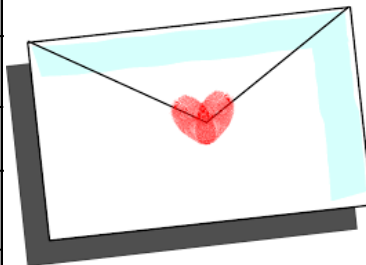

Unpopular Opinion Corner: Annotating Is . . . Not That Bad

English class, in general, is a fun class. Especially for students who love to read and write. Students get to use their creative minds to think about and discuss a variety of texts. They can even write essays and stories about topics they enjoy.

There are many interesting aspects of English class, but the most iconic part of English is reading. Some students love to read, and others hate it—but almost every student can agree on one thing:

Annotating is the worst thing about English class.

Students complain that having to stop and write what the author is doing takes them out of the flow of the book, and that they can't enjoy the story as much.

However . . . is it really as horrible as everyone thinks it is?

For starters, annotating isn't as difficult as everyone makes it out to be. While most students complain that it's hard to write down their thoughts, the truth of the matter is, it's easy. People with journals do it all the time, and writing down your thoughts in a journal is no different than writing down your thoughts in a book.

There is a constant stream of thoughts going through your head every second. With this in mind, you don't have to stop and think about what deep and meaningful statement you want to write. All you need to do is point out what you notice, when you notice it, and write down small notes about exactly what you're thinking.

If one does this, then annotating gets exponentially easier, and more entertaining, as you feel like you're having a conversation with the author rather than just listening to them.

Now that we've established that annotating isn't as difficult as you may think it is, you may still argue that it has no purpose to your reading, and only slows you down. Well, that statement is both true and false.

Annotating is *supposed* to slow you down and make you think more critically about the reading according to our English teachers.

According to Mrs. Blevins, it is important

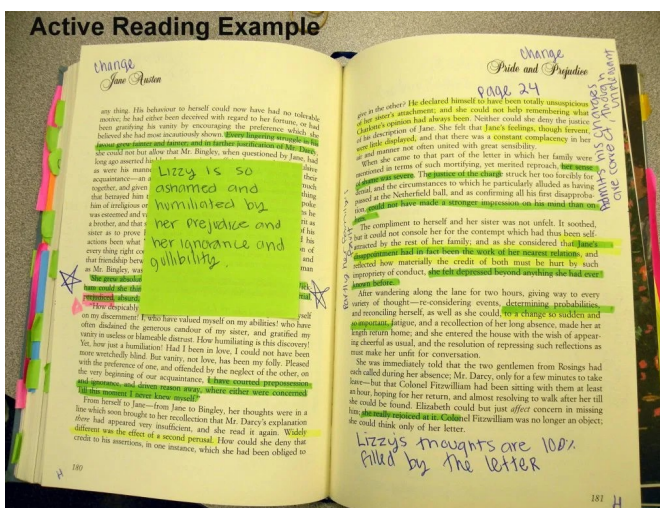

"because it forces [students] to slow down when reading."

Generally speaking, if one reads a book for school without annotating, then he will likely skim through it and not focus on it as much as he should to fully understand it. His mind may wander while reading, and he may miss key events in the story. Then, when he has a quiz on the material, he won't know as many specifics because he rushed through the book too fast and didn't catch the important information—and then, he might fail the quiz.

While some students believe they are able to process all the information without annotating, the majority of students will try to get their reading done as quickly as possible—and, therefore, they will miss more information as a result. That's why annotating is so important when it comes to reading.

Moving along from how annotating affects the ability to process information, let's discuss how it helps you study for tests. For most classes, you would probably look for answers in your textbook, right? It's rather easy to find the chapter or find a word in the index of a textbook so you can review.

But what about a test in English on a book you just read? How do you study for that? Do you reread the entire book? That seems rather tedious. Perhaps you instead get a reading guide from your teacher. But how do you fill it out? You'd have to reread the book to find all the information again.

That is, if you didn't annotate.

The truth is, annotating lets you mark the important events of the book so you can go back and review them for tests and quizzes.

According to English department chair Mrs. Yuhas, "It's like a textbook for English class."

What she is saying is, students aren't given textbooks for the books they are reading, but annotating is like making your own textbook inside the book. It gives you the ability to easily look back through the book and find all the information that you need to review for any major or minor assessment.

Annotating is very helpful, for many reasons. While many may still disagree and say that it can be boring and tedious, I can see your point and everyone is entitled to his own opinion.

While you may disagree with me, it doesn't change the fact that annotating does, in fact, improve your understanding of the book—and it is not nearly as difficult as many people set it out to be.

So what do you think now? Do you still believe annotating is the worst thing ever, and that you should never have to do it? Or do you now see the importance and simplicity of annotating, and understand its usefulness in making you a better English student?

Why should we care about the rainforest burning down?

The Amazon Rainforest is critical to the Earth. Known as “The lungs of the Earth,” the Amazon provides twenty percent of our oxygen and would also negatively affect our current fight against climate change.

In addition, the Amazon also gives humans medicine, such as cortisone, and it is home to millions of animals and plants. Without the Amazon, many whole species would die.

In an article from August of 2019 from *The Washington Post*, writer Andrew Freedman explains that “...a key element of any plan to restrain climate change. Any increase in deforestation there would speed up global warming as well as damage an important refuge for biodiversity.”

How can we help?

We can help end the Rainforest fires, but stopping the gigantic fire will be challenging—and the solutions are unclear. However, one of the ways to stop some of the burning will be changing the root problems. This includes “slash and burn,” which is a form of deforestation.

In 2015, the Brazilian government elimi-

nated the countries ban on illegal deforestation.

In an article in *The Washington Post*, environmentalist Paulo Moutinho says that “the fire is a consequence of deforestation and if you’re not going to address this deforestation you are just going to make some treatment that doesn’t make any kind of effect in the long-term.”

That said, to stop the fire, he suggests Brazilians need to stop old habits.

You personally can help the cause by donating money to organizations, such as The Amazon Conservation Association at amazonconservation.org to provide relief.

We may seem far removed from the situation, but should not wait until we have lost a large portion of our oxygen, a great number of materials for medicines and millions of species realize we should have done something.

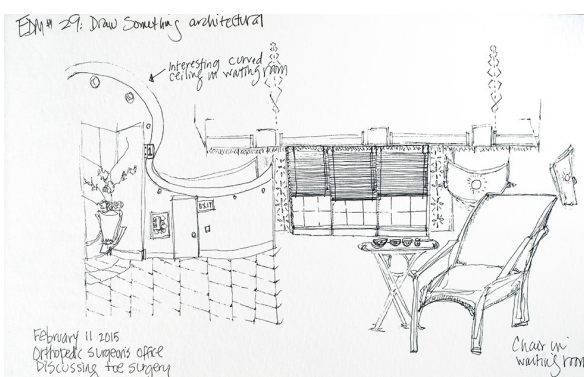
Have you ever wondered how some people can draw really well? When I have to draw, I cringe a little on the inside knowing I am not one of those people who can draw at all—never mind well.

The World Series Clash: Astros vs. Nationals

The regular baseball season games have come to an end. In the World Series, the Houston Astros and Washington Nationals are now clashing—and history has been made because, for the first time in World Series, five of the top 10 pitchers in strikeouts in the regular season are in the series.

The best part of it all is that the Astros and Nationals share the same spring training facility in West Palm Beach, Fla., and now the two teams meet on baseball's biggest stage to determine the World Series champion.

Now, more about the teams . . . After 86 years, the Nationals are finally in the World Series. They haven't won a single one but they will be trying especially after their long road here.

Before the season, they lost Bryce Harper, their most dynamic player, to the Philadelphia Phillies after his contract ended, and then got off to a slow start.

On May 23, they were 10 games out of first place in the National League East. The post season was a different story. They came from behind to win the Wild Card Game over the Brewers. The Nationals then won the final two games of the NLDS (National League Division Series) to upset the top-seeded Dodgers before sweeping

the NL Central-winning Cardinals to reach the World Series.

According to eighth grader Sean Siracusa, "After all, they have been through they just have to win the World Series."

It was a more straightforward road for the Astros.

They had baseball's best record in the regular season, going 107-55. Astros starters struck out 28.9% of the batters they faced in the regular season, the highest rate in MLB history. Last year, the Astros set a franchise record for most wins in a season then they came back even stronger this year and beat that record.

With 107 victories in 2019, only a dozen teams in history have won more games than the Astros did this season. This 107 win marked the third straight 100 win season for

the Astros. Only five other teams have done that (the 1929-31 Oakland Athletics, the 1942-44 Cardinals, the 1969-71 Baltimore Orioles, the 1997-99 Atlanta Braves and the 2002-2004 New York Yankees), and with 311 wins since 2017, only one of those five (the Orioles) won more games in their three-year run than the Astros.

In post season, the Astros went on to win the ALDS, even though they had to play all five games of the series against the Rays. Even with a Game 1 loss in the ALCS,

they defeated the Yankees in six games. Unsurprisingly, the Astros (going for their second title in three years) are the favorites to win the World Series over the Nationals.

All in all, this season was a good one, and the World Series match-up seems very intense with all the Astros and National have done throughout the season.

According to an article on ESPN, sports writer David Schoenfeld agrees.

"It is a sporting event so wonderful it requires two names: The World Series or The Fall Classic," said Schoenfeld.

Not much else can be said about the World Series or the regular season regarding these teams, so let's hope the whole series is as exciting as the teams have made the rest of the season.

Post Malone Album Highlights

Austin Richard Post, also known as Post Malone, released his third studio album *Hollywood's Bleeding* on Sept. 6, 2019, following his critically acclaimed album *Beerbongs and Bentleys* in 2018.

Malone is considered a rapper by most; however, I believe he is not bound by a genre. He shows talent in all styles of his music from singing, rapping, his beat choice and use of instrumentals.

Without further ado, here are the highlights of his newest album.

Track 1: "Hollywood's Bleeding"

From what I understand from his lyrics, Malone speaks out about an overlooked concept by many people living in Hollywood. When he says "everyone" in the line "Everyone's gone but nobody's leaving," he means the souls and personalities of people who lived there, and the bodies that aren't leaving are all lifeless walking shells.

When he says, "Hollywood is bleeding, but we call it home" he means that Hollywood is like a broken home, but the people living in it aren't trying to fix it.

The beat is so well done in this track, and it further shows the dark and sad message of the song. The slow guitar gives a dramatic and crippling heart-sinking feeling to the listener. Even when the beat switches, you get the same message of sadness, but with a hint of anger. When the beat returns to the drums, it keeps the intensity, then makes a very smooth transition back to the more melancholy but strong tone.

Rating: (8/10)

The song does a very nice job of showing what the album is about. It explores a dark and complex concept that many people overlook when it comes to celebrities and Hollywood as a whole.

Track 6: "Circles"

The metaphors given in the chorus are hard hitting. For example, "Seasons change and our love went cold" or "Run away but we're running in circles." The song tells a story of Malone in a relationship, trying to save the other person from getting emotionally hurt. He takes the blame for not being a better part of the relationship, and he also admits he is ready to give up on something it is time to let go of.

The drums, guitars and even Malone's

voice do a great job of making a chill beat—especially for a song about everything falling apart. It is so nice to listen to; you might find your head nodding side to side all of a sudden!

Rating: (8/10)

Sonically and lyrically, this song is so fun to listen to. It never gets old and is one of those songs to just close your eyes and listen to again and again.

Track 8: "On The Road" (feat. Lil Baby and Meek Mill)

Despite his age, Malone explains that he has been through a lot when it comes to becoming as popular as he is—and the people who weren't there for him. He promises the listener that he won't sell out like many have said he will.

Lil Baby and Meek Mill's verses in this song are so different from Malone's, in terms of flow. I like the way they fall in and out of the beat, giving diversity to the song.

The beat is also basic, which is good, as it allows one to focus on Malone's vocals and not be drowned out. There is not too much to mention about the beat, which is fine, but it allows the artists on the track to be dynamic with their flows.

Rating: (8/10)

The message in this song is very honest. Malone shows his true colors when it comes to his feelings about the people who weren't there for him. The featured artists

give a completely different sound than Malone himself as well, which allows you to focus on each of them.

Track 9: "Take What You Want" (Feat. Ozzy Osborne and Travis Scott)

This song hits hard, and it is so nice to listen to. The chorus is simple and works wonders for the track. Malone's lines are good, but his voice is absolutely amazing and outshines his own lyrics.

As well, the addition of Ozzy Osborne is definitely the best feature on this album. His voice fits perfectly on the track and makes it sound almost dystopian. Not to be outdone, Travis Scott does what he does best with his autotune rap.

What makes the track especially great is how each artist incorporates each of their own styles.

The guitars and drums give one goosebumps, and the rap segments of the beat are great and mold well into the song. Everyone's voice rides the beat so well, and nothing seems out of place. However, the guitar solo at the end steals the show and is probably the best way to end the song.

Tech Time: “Dark” New Features of iOS 13

iOS 13 is the latest of tech giant Apple’s software updates for mobile devices. This year brought many major changes, two of the most notable ones being dark mode and iPadOS, more to come on both of those. Ever since Apple’s release at their Worldwide Developers Conference (WWDC) people everywhere have been waiting for the release of iOS 13, which came in late June.

As an Apple Developer, I tried to attend WWDC but couldn’t. But when the developer beta softwares were released, I jumped on the opportunity to get them. A beta software is a pre-release of sorts. The software is released full of bugs and glitches, that you report to Apple to help them make the alpha release better. I had all the developer betas. The features of iOS 13 are endless, so here are a few favorites, and the ones you will use mostly:

Dark Mode: Everyone has been waiting for Apple to release its dark mode feature, which makes all Apple first party apps that usually appear white, black, but only if you customize it this way. For example, settings can appear white on black, which means white words and labels will appear on a black background. Messages also changes, your texts are still blue, but your recipient’s texts to you are now dark gray, and so are the dots that tell you if you are replying.

iPadOS: If you are an iPad user you may have noticed that the iPhone software and iPad software have slowly grown less alike.

Now, Apple made the official change, and split them into two different softwares. All iPhones above the iPhone 6s run iOS 13,

and all iPads newer than the Mini3, run iPadOS 13.

Sign in with Apple: If you have various passwords and accounts for different apps and websites, check out Sign in with Apple. This feature automatically creates an account for you with your AppleID information that you can use to sign in automatically. This feature is good for people who don’t remember passwords and/or who have various passwords for different apps.

Volume Changer: Finally, the big block that disturbs the view of your screen for seconds at a time is gone. It has been replaced by a small slider that you can adjust

using your finger, and it takes up almost no space on the screen. This is a huge improvement because Apple has been getting complaints for all 13 years of iOS, aimed at the volume changer.

Memoji Stickers: Your customizable Animoji character can now react in emoji stickers. For example, there is a sticker for your Memoji with its eyes as hearts, or with your head exploding. You can use them to react to text messages using a drag and drop feature, or you can send them with a caption. Memoji is an Animoji that you can customize to look like you, and it follows your movement when you talk or move your head.

Shortcuts: Using the Shortcuts app, you can quickly complete actions, instead of taking multi-step processes. For example, instead of opening the Messages app and scrolling through your messages so you can text your mom, you can open the shortcuts app and press a single button and viola, you have texted her.

W&R 7th grader Lily Ayer says, “I love all the customizable options.”

When asked about Dark Mode, sophomore Anika Patel stated, “It’s really cool and it’s a new view for the phone. I like it more than the light mode!”

Criticalhit.net claims that the film will be a “wild technical marvel that needs to be seen on the big screen.”



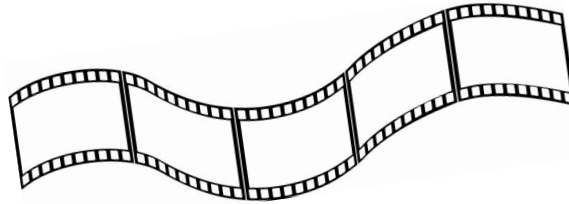
3. *Maleficent: Mistress of Evil*

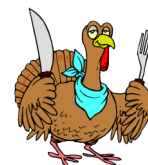

"Welcome," she says. "You're one of us now." 

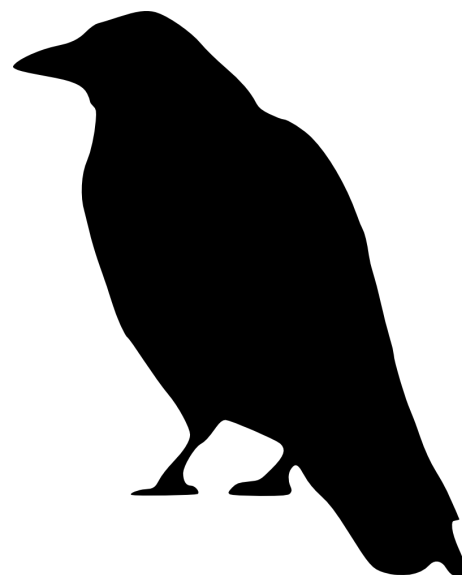
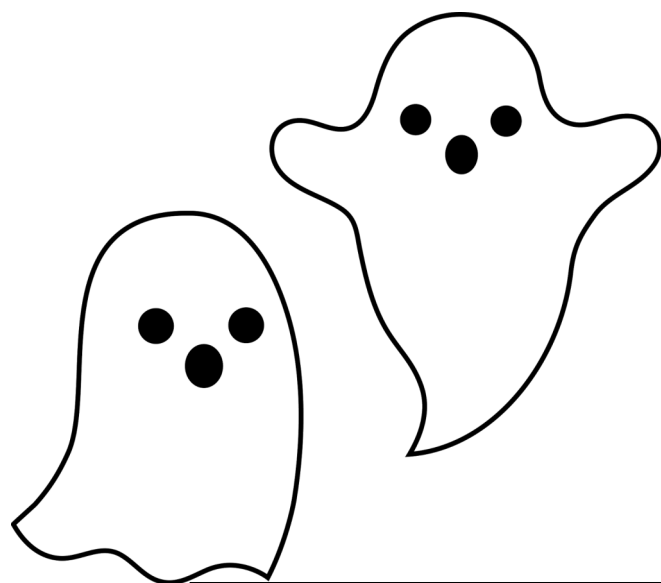

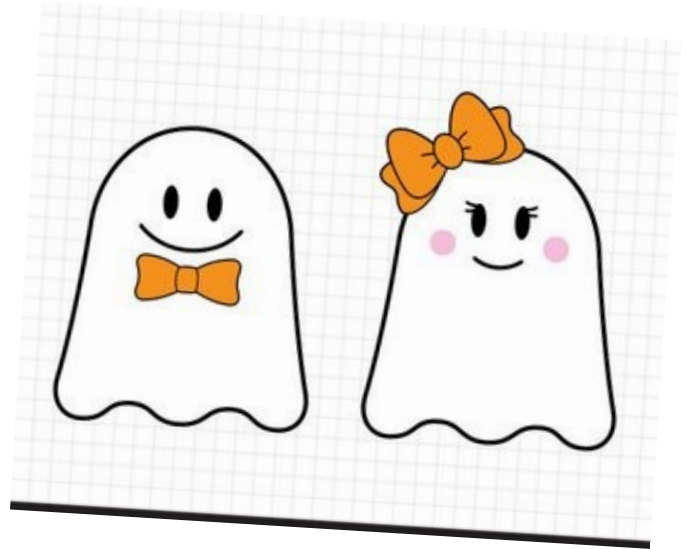
